<b>~</b>	You're assuming that the true nature of a mind can only be accessed by that same mind
<b>~</b>	Just because you can't imagine the mind being divided into parts, doesn't mean it's impossible
<b>~</b>	Minds do have parts: memories, fears, desires, and so on
