Multiple Answer 5 points

The character in the Gennaro dialogue who sympathizes with dualism proposed the argument: *Minds aren't divisible in the sense of having parts, but my physical body and brain are, so my mind has to be non-physical*. How many of the following objections does their opponent raise?

- My mind might just be a small physical part of my brain, too small to be divided
- You can't divide a brain without risking serious injury
- Some parts of an amnesiac's mind are hidden from them
- People with multiple personalities/dissociative identity disorder have a single mind that's divided
- You're assuming that the true nature of a mind can only be accessed by that same mind
- Just because you can't imagine the mind being divided into parts, doesn't mean it's impossible
- Minds do have parts: memories, fears, desires, and so on
